**STORY TELLING ACTIVITIES**  
2007

1. Story Sacks-a large brightly coloured bag filled with interesting objects. A child chooses an object from the sack and a story is made up round the object.
2. Story Boxes-Small boxes (e.g. a shoe box) filled with things relating to a particular topic. The class or group choose a box and a story is built up round the objects.
3. Stepping Stones-Parts of a story are written on large paper stepping stones and the children use them to remind them of the story (stepping from stone to stone).
4. Flower Pot and Seeds-Teacher has a large paper flower pot and the story written on some large paper seeds. The seeds are then "planted" in the pots the story is told. The children can then use the "seeds" to retell the story.
5. Magic Cauldron-The teacher has a large paper cauldron with story settings, plots, characters, beginnings, endings, etc., in it. The children then take these out of the cauldron and build up a story.
6. Interactive Storytelling-The children learn a story by heart using actions when certain words are said in the story.
